Method of analysis

1,783,681 Scottish job ads have been analysed and matched to 8,190 of the skills in Pearson's proprietary ontology. Using this monthly skills data from January 2020 to March 2024, skills fitting the following criteria have been identified:

- **Popular skills:** Skills which currently appear in the highest percentage of job ads; popularity is defined as the percentage of job ads the skill appears in.
- Trending skills: Skills which have experienced the greatest increase in popularity across the last year.
- **Emerging skills:** Skills which are expected to trend soon skills which have historically been unpopular but show the early signs of future popularity.

Where a skill is flagged as specialised, either to a job or job family, this is because TF-IDF analysis has identified the skill as particularly important to this job/job family compared to all jobs, across all job families.

To find popular, trending and emerging skills by region, ads have been geocoded and mapped to a region. Each piece of analysis is by region – for example, popular skills in the Highlands and Islands are those which currently appear in the highest percentage of Highlands and Islands job ads.

Regional boundaries

Within Scotland, 32 council areas (1996) correspond to 4 NUTS 3 regions. The council areas are aggregated to regions as follows:












