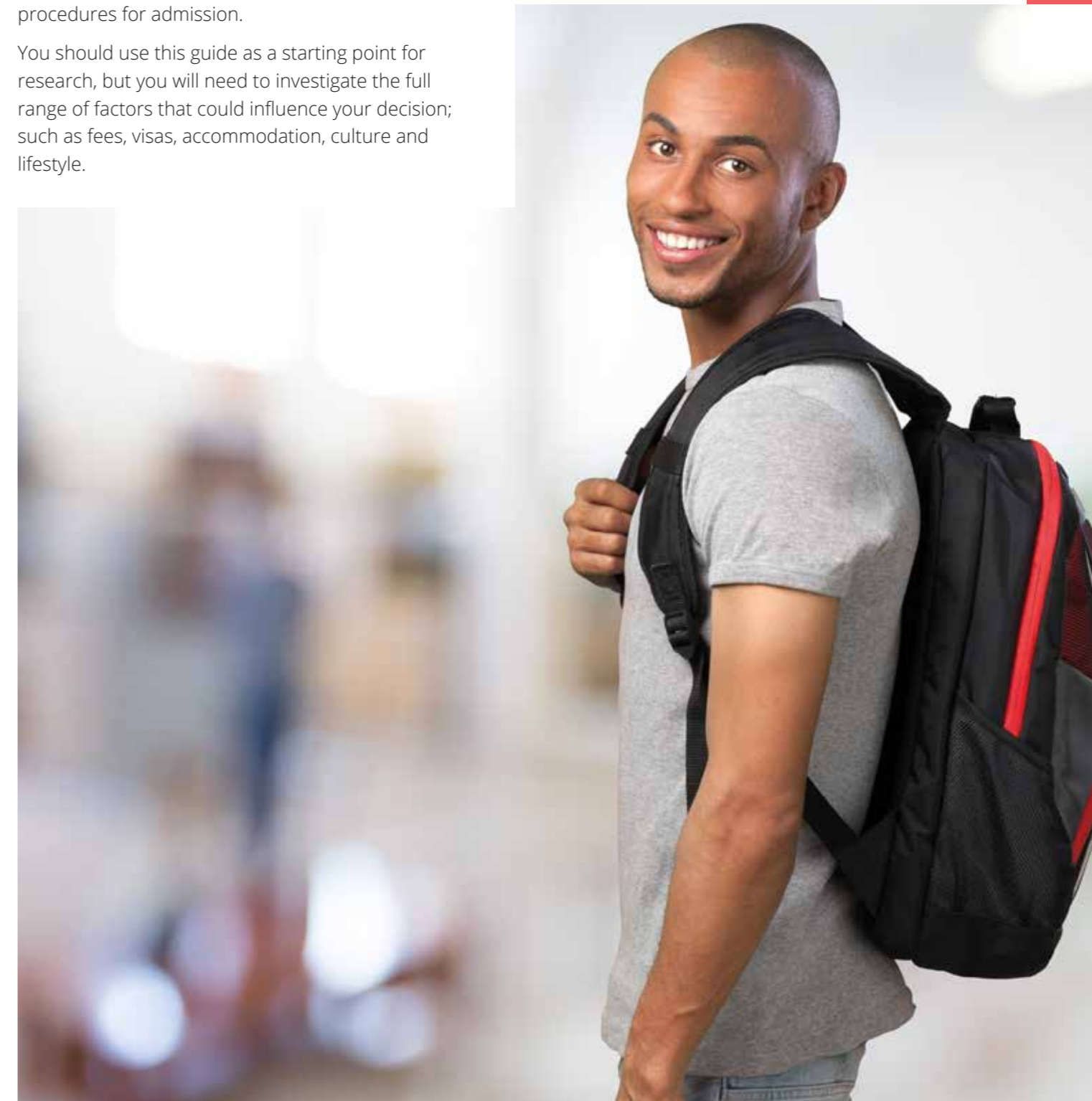
About this guide

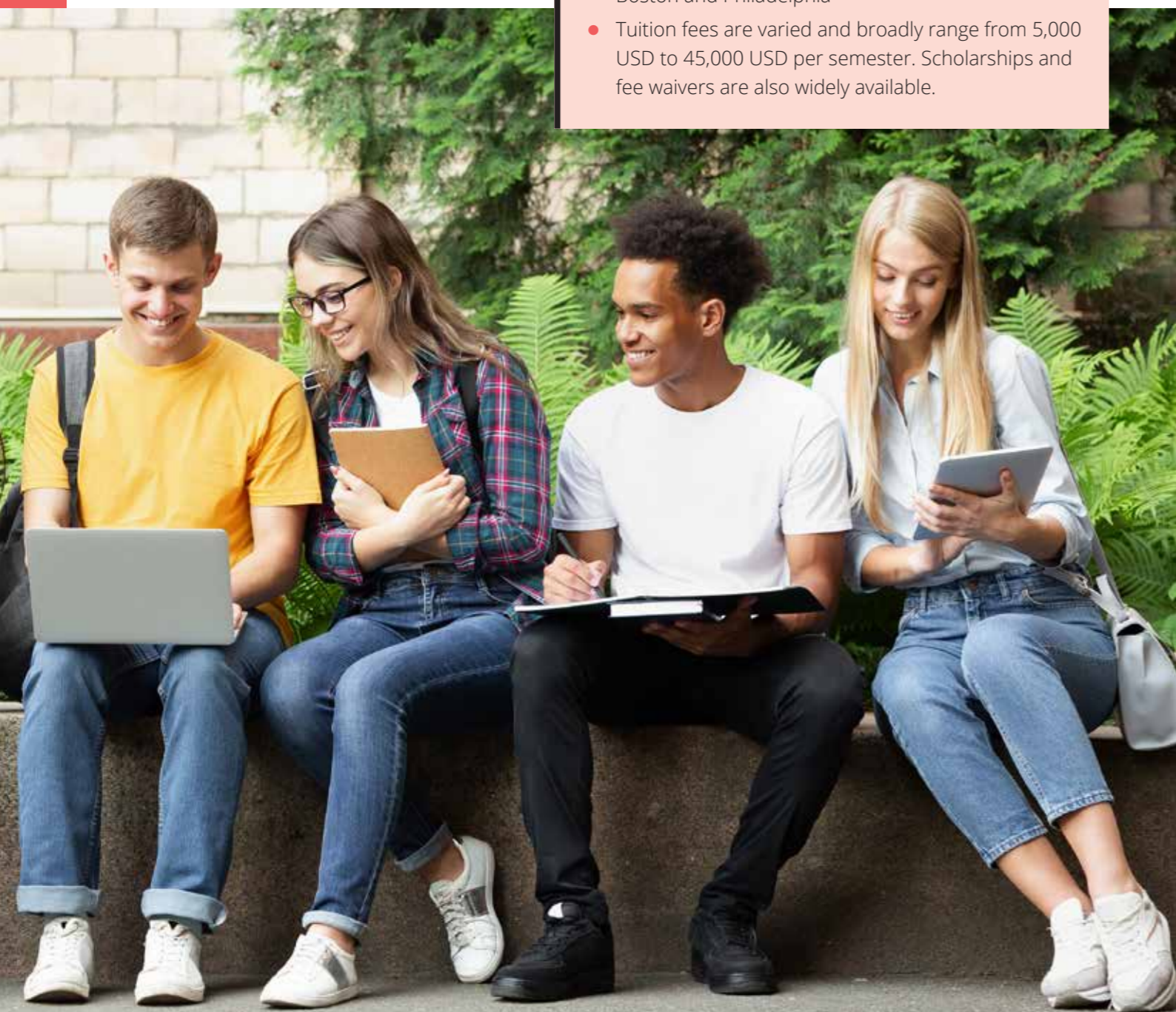
Destination USA

US higher education institutions

With a wide variety of academic programmes and top-ranked institutions, the United States offers a wealth of higher education opportunities for international students.

The USA in brief

- Over 4,000 higher education institutions
- More international students than any other country
- Six universities in the world top 10 (THES) and five universities in the world top 10 (QS)
- Leading student cities with more than 300,000 students include New York, Los Angeles, Chicago, Boston and Philadelphia
- Tuition fees are varied and broadly range from 5,000 USD to 45,000 USD per semester. Scholarships and fee waivers are also widely available.



About US universities

US university types

There are an estimated 4,000 institutions and universities and other higher education institutions in the USA. US universities are commonly referred to as colleges and there are three main types:

- **Community colleges:** these are state institutions with open admissions policies. They mostly offer two-year associate degrees from which students commonly transfer onto bachelor's degree programs. Tuition fees are generally low.
- **Public universities and colleges:** these are large, state-funded institutions that have lower tuition fees but more students.
- **Private universities and colleges:** these are smaller universities funded by private donations, tuition fees and grants. The opposite of public colleges, they have higher fees but fewer students.

The world's top universities

The US has several of the world top 10 universities.

US university semesters

The US academic year is divided into two semesters; fall that runs from mid-August to December, and spring that runs from January to May.

15 academic credits are usually considered to be a full semester of work.

Types of degrees

There are two main types of undergraduate degree on offer in the USA:

- **Associate degrees:** take two years to complete and are usually studied at community colleges. Students can study for an associate qualification in a range of subjects and then transfer to a bachelor's programme to complete an additional two years of study to gain a bachelor's degree. Associate degrees usually require 60 credits to complete.
- **Bachelor's degrees:** take four years to complete. Students study a variety of subjects before deciding on which to focus on in the final two years, known as a 'major'. Students may also gain a 'minor' qualification by completing classes in an additional subject alongside their 'major'. Bachelor's degrees usually require 120 credits to complete.

The US application process

Research your options

In such a large country with a huge choice of universities and colleges, research is essential.

There are several elements that you will need to consider:

- **Location:** the US has six time zones and a number of different climates. Consider the size of city that you want to study in and the accessibility of that city from your home country.
- **Your course of study:** not all degrees are available at undergraduate level. Medicine, Veterinary Science, Law and Pharmacy are studied as graduate degrees. In most cases you will be able to follow a range of courses in years one and two before selecting your major in years three and four.
- **Start your research early:** so that you can meet application deadlines which can in some cases be very early. You can obtain support from official advisors all over the world.

Consider finance

You will need to research the costs of tuition and living costs; both vary considerably. With planning you may be able to reduce the costs or obtain support.

You can find the cost of tuition on many university websites, and you can also obtain information on open scholarships from the US Department of Education and from the Fulbright Commission.

You may also be able to reduce the cost of tuition by obtaining credit for International or UK A or AS levels.



Make your application

Most universities and colleges take a holistic approach to admissions. All aspects of an application are considered although undoubtedly performance in school exams are the most important part.

There are several ways to apply to US universities. Many universities will give you the option of applying directly or through an app giving you the option of applying to multiple universities:

- **The Common App:** is the most common and accepted by over 900 universities.
- **The Coalition App:** is accepted by over 100 universities and then individual applications are only accepted at some others.

The Common App allows you to apply to up to 20 universities at once. You can enter your A level results in the Testing Section under Senior Secondary Leaving Examinations. You will need to upload one of two essay questions and include details of extra-curricular activities.

Recommendations letters are also required; these should come from your school and potentially other people as well such as internship supervisors, sports' coaches etc.

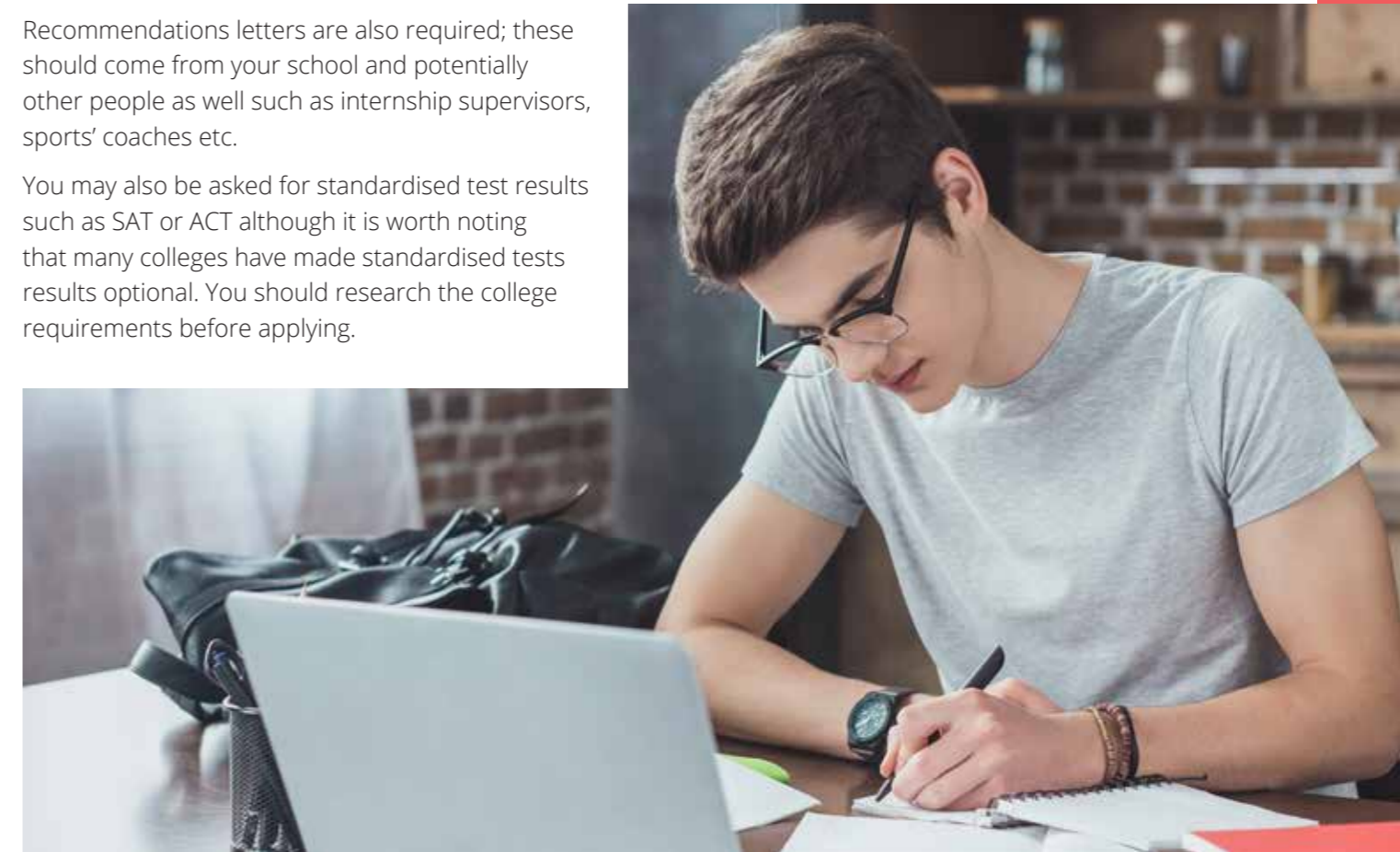
You may also be asked for standardised test results such as SAT or ACT although it is worth noting that many colleges have made standardised tests results optional. You should research the college requirements before applying.

GPA is the grading system used by US high schools and you might be asked to convert International A level letter grades or International GCSE 9-1 grades into GPA. You should approach a NACES approved credential Evaluation Agency to have a report produced.

You may also be able/asked to have an interview either with a member of the admissions team or an alumni representative.

If English is not your native language, you may be asked to provide proof of English language knowledge – Pearson PTE, IELTS and TOEFL tests are widely accepted. Many universities will waive the requirements for a test if you have been schooled in English (i.e. as part of an International or UK A level course).

It should be noted that the university will make a decision whether to offer you a place based on your complete application; meeting minimum grade requirements may not be enough to ensure admission.

The advantages of Pearson Edexcel qualifications

Widely recognised for US university admissions

There are advantages to applying for university admission in the USA with Pearson Edexcel GCSEs and A levels.

Pearson Edexcel A levels are widely recognised in the USA for admission to higher education institutions, and additionally completing Pearson Edexcel International A levels (IAL®) may permit you to obtain higher education credits in the USA.

You should verify with the university to which you are applying, the exact amount of credit they are willing to offer.

Example 1: Indiana University (IU)

Indiana University provide a range of [different credits](#) from 1st year courses for different International A levels. Depending on the combination of A levels, you can obtain a full year of credit.

For example, a student applying with International A level grades CCC in Chemistry, Biology and Maths could obtain as much as 31 credits. You can check the amount of credit you can obtain on the IU online calculator.

Example 2: ECE

As one of the leading credential evaluation agencies in the US, ECE work with hundreds of colleges throughout the USA. ECE recommend that credit be given to Pearson Edexcel International A levels (IAL®). You can read their statement on [our website](#).

Example 3: IERF

IERF are a leading credential evaluation agency working with hundreds of colleges throughout the USA. They recommend that completed International A levels should receive [six to eight college semester credits](#) per subject.

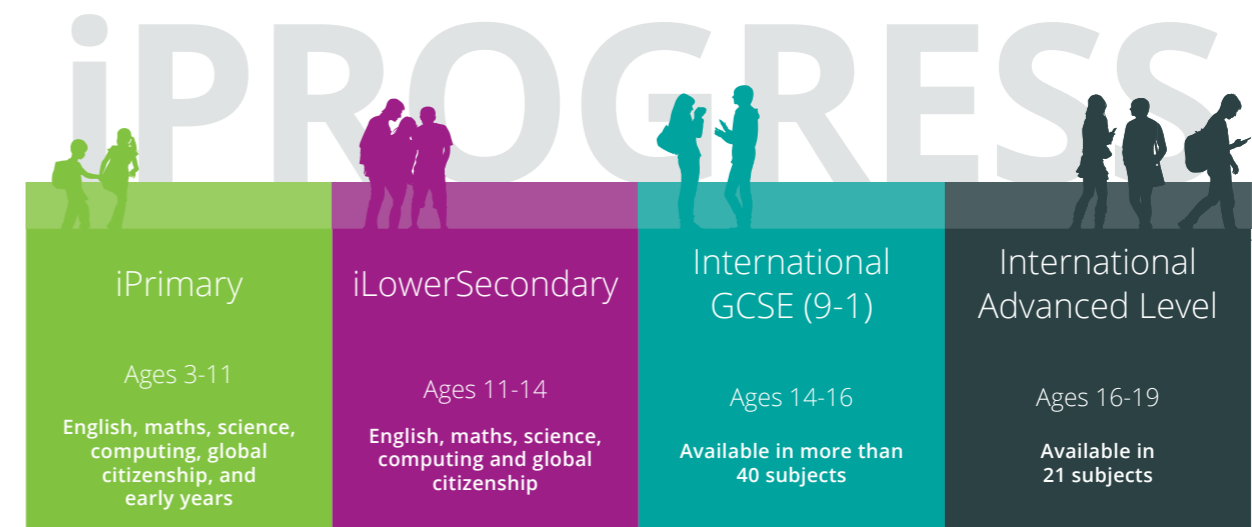


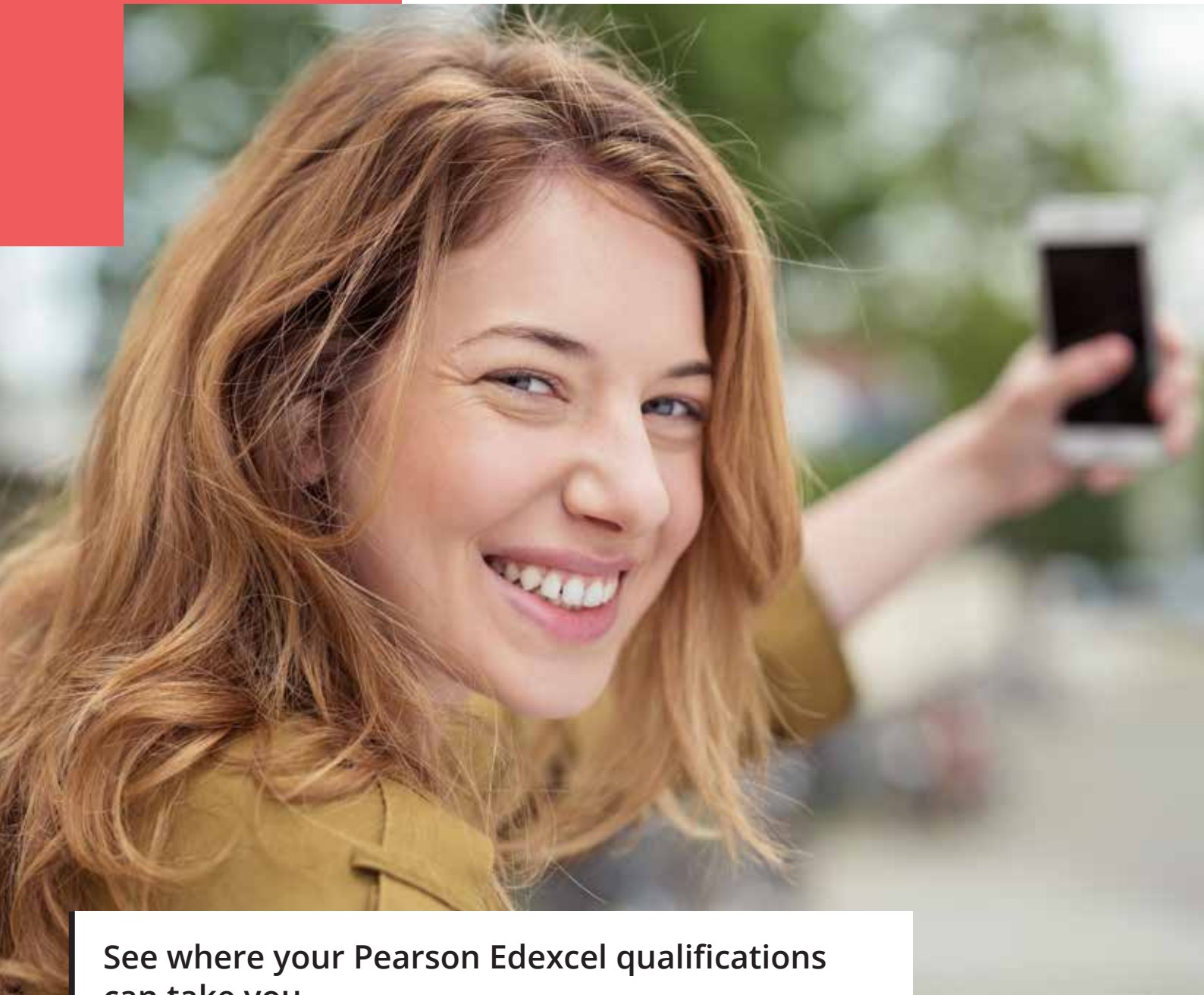
