Winner of the BTEC Hospitality, Travel and Tourism Student of the Year 2019, Luke Bearpark hails from Exeter College, where his programme leader, Joanne Watkins, describes him as a 'shining example of vocational excellence.' Luke's flawless success in his studies – and the fact that he has subsequently managed to land himself (no pun intended) a dream job with British Airways – reflects what can happen when passionate people and excellent training combine.

It's rare to find somebody who constantly gives the best of themselves and consistently goes above and beyond what is expected, but Luke is the embodiment of this. "When it comes to work towards the course. I set myself the highest standards I can.
